The Diplomat Despite China's Tough Talk, US Should Move Forward With Taiwan

U.S.-Taiwan relations have improved significantly since President Tsai Ing-wen's inauguration in 2016, and President Donald Trump's in 2017. Both administrations have dedicated efforts to explore developing U.S.-Taiwan relations beyond the Taiwan Relations Act of 1979 (TRA).

Many will argue that going down a path of improved U.S.-Taiwan relations is both unnecessary and dangerous, meaninglessly risking China's wrath. Such critics would argue that the TRA is enough, and there is no need to expand U.S.-Taiwan ties further. But Chinese antagonism toward warming U.S.-Taiwan relations must be seen in a new context, which will show why Taiwan's upgraded international participation is not only necessary, but also vital for the ongoing U.S. Indo-Pacific Strategy.

As China's economic and military might rises, the United States needs all the partners it has to tackle this new geopolitical reality. An upgraded U.S.-Taiwan relationship will only serve, not harm, that goal. Taiwan has much to contribute beyond mere cross-strait relations.

Taiwan's ITRI Strikes Electric Vehicle Deal in Thailand

The Industrial Technology Research Institute (ITRI, 工研院) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Thai company Panus Assembly to develop electric vehicles in the latest example of Taiwan's New Southbound Policy.

The policy, implemented since 2016, strives for closer economic, cultural and tourism links with the nations of South and Southeast Asia, including Thailand.

At the same time, ITRI also forged an "electric bus alliance" between Taiwanese and Thai companies which would allow parts suppliers from the island to expand their business overseas, the Liberty Times reported. Eventually, Taiwan could export 300 electric buses to Southeast Asia, according to estimates.

Taiwan's New Southbound Policy Attracts More ASEAN Companies to List on TWSE

Taiwan Stock Exchange Corporation (TWSE) announced on Tuesday (June 11) that in addition to Vietnam, Thailand has become an important trade partner of Taiwan, with three Thai companies listing in Taiwan, reported Central News Agency.

The three Thai companies listed on TWSE are printed circuit board manufacturer Apex International (泰鼎-KY), maker of precision metal parts JPP-KY, and jewelry maker Regal Jewelry Group (日成-KY), according to TWSE.

As more Thailand-based businesses are expected to list publicly in Taiwan, TWSE's representatives left for Bangkok on Monday (June 10) to hold "Taiwan Capital Market Overview" seminars for interested companies.

Taiwan Today International Conference on Disaster Mitigation and Earth Sciences Concludes in Taipei

The "Promoting International Collaboration of Earth Sciences and Smart Disaster Reduction in Southeast Asia" conference wrapped up June 10 in Taipei City, strengthening regional cooperation across such areas as environmental adaption and risk assessment.

Sponsored by the Ministry of Science and Technology, the one-day seminar was coorganized by Academia Sinica, Taiwan's foremost research institution. It drew 37 officials and scholars from nine Asia-Pacific countries including Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, New Zealand and Thailand.

Among the keynote speakers were Chen Yue-gau, geosciences professor at National Taiwan University in Taipei; Renato Solidum Jr., undersecretary for Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change at the Philippines' Department of Science and Technology; and Mark Stirling, geology professor at the University of Otago in New Zealand.

Tarrant Pleads Not Guilty to All Charges

The main suspect in the Christchurch attacks in March, has pleaded not guilty to all charges.

Brenton Tarrant is charged with the murder of 51 people, 40 counts of attempted murder and one terrorism charge in New Zealand's deadliest peace time mass shooting.

A number of the survivors of the attack and relatives of the victims were in court for the hearing, the BBC's Sydney correspondent Hywel Griffith reported.

As lawyer Shane Tait read out his client's not guilty pleas, a number of those present gasped and became tearful.
