

Minister of Culture Cheng Li-chiun Visits TAEF

 ${f M}$ inister of Culture Cheng Li-chiun visited TAEF on July 23. She was received by TAEF Chairman Dr. H.H. Michael Hsiao. The visit aimed to discuss how the Ministry of Culture of Taiwan and related organizations, such as the Cultural Taiwan Foundation, can substantially cooperate with Taiwan's New Southbound Policy. Ministry of Culture of Taiwan has been dedicated to preserving traditional crafts, repairing cultural heritage and cultivating Taiwan's soft power in the areas of arts and humanities.

Taiwan Delegation Joins 'Startup Thailand' Conference in Bangkok

In Bangkok, Thailand, the "Startup Thailand" conference to promote technological innovation across Southeast Asia is taking place July 23-27, with over 500 startups representing 25 countries set to participate.

With the aim of supporting technological innovation and startups in Taiwan, as well as those in targeted New Southbound Policy countries, Taiwan is also taking part in the event with a delegation of 30 people. The National Development Council is sponsoring a select group of 15 Taiwanese startup enterprises through its Asia Silicon Valley Development Plan (ASVIDA).

US Treasury Department Assistant Secretary Visits Taiwan

The U.S. acting assistant secretary responsible for international markets, Mitchell Silk, is on a two-day visit to Taiwan from July 17.

This is the first time for Silk to visit Taiwan as an acting assistant secretary. Nevertheless, Silk is no stranger to the island nation, as he used to learn Chinese in Taipei, according to Taiwan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA). His professional career in East Asia has spanned over 15 years.

MOFA said it hopes that with Silk's visit, both Taiwan and the U.S. will continue discussing opportunities for substantive cooperation under the Indo-Pacific strategy and Taiwan's New Southbound Policy.
