Initiated in 2017, the annual forum serves as a platform for regional dialogue and promotion of the New Southbound Policy initiated by the Tsai administration in 2016. Speaking at the opening ceremony, President Tsai urged "more cooperation between Indo-Pacific societies to take collective actions" to achieve the goal for inclusive growth and sustainable development.

# New Southbound Policy: Minister confident on policy progress

Trade between Taiwan and New Southbound countries in the first six months of 2018 rose 5.8 percent annually to US\$56.92 billion. From January to July, Taiwanese companies won bids for 20 construction projects in the targeted countries amounting to NT\$25 billion. While overall investment has dipped, this year saw significant increases in the Malaysian, Indian and Vietnamese markets, Minister Deng said. Taiwan and the Philippines also signed a bilateral investment agreement (BIA) that took effect in March. Read more

Last year, Thailand collected \$57 billion in international tourism receipts, nearly doubling Macao (\$36 billion), Japan (\$34 billion), Hong Kong (\$33 billion), and China (\$33 billion). Globally, the only countries that out-earn Thailand in terms of tourism dollars are France (\$61 billion), Spain (\$68 billion), and the United States—which handily takes the gold medal, at \$211 billion.
