

Taiwan and Indonesia Sign MOU on Comprehensive Economic Collaboration

Taiwan and Indonesia signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on November 19th to boost economic exchange and to advance collaboration between the two countries in compliance with Taiwan's New Southbound Policy. Under the agreements, the two sides will establish an institutional communications platform to hold bilateral discussions on topics such as special economic zones, trade, investment, real estate, agriculture, and administrator training. Additionally, a special assistance group will be designated to support Taiwanese enterprises in their effort to grasp business opportunities in Indonesia.

New Southbound Policy: Project Eyes Solid Ties in Healthcare

Wednesday, November 14th, 2018

The Ministry of Health and Welfare on June 1 launched a one-year "One Country, One Center" program and commissioned the Chung-Hua Institution for Economic Research and other think tanks to establish the Health and Welfare New Southbound Policy Project Office to assist in coordinating related tasks. Under the project, seven large Taiwanese hospitals each formed six medical teams to act as the main coordinator for integrating local medical resources, to extend medical and healthcare cooperation with one of the six partner nations chosen for the project's initial stage.

Maldives to Pull Out of 'One-Sided' China Trade Deal, Reports Say

The Maldives is reportedly planning to pull out of a free trade agreement with China as the island nation moves closer to India and the West after Ibrahim Mohamed Solih won the presidency in a September election. Indian Prime Minister Modi came to Solih's inauguration, his first ever visit to the country.

These Are the Asian Countries That Benefit From the Trade War

November 20th, 2018

Nomura Holdings Inc. found that a push by companies in the U.S. and China for import substitution towards the rest of Asia will benefit Malaysia in particular, followed by Japan, Pakistan, Thailand and the Philippines, based on its analysis of specific products on the list of tariffs. Of the 13 countries in its analysis, Bangladesh, India and South Korea are the least likely to gain from import substitution.
