The International Boycott of Confucius Institutes Expands the Cultural Appeal of Taiwan Studies

Since China launched the Confucius Institute Global Expansion Plan in 2004, thousands of Confucius Institutes and Confucius classrooms were established. The Confucius Institute aimed to cooperate with internationally renowned universities and higher education institutions; promoting Chinese education, but also cultivate a pro-Beijing community.

Whether it is a Confucius Institute or a Confucius Classroom, it has become an accredited and distorted version of Chinese culture and Chinese teaching curriculum promoted by the Communist Party in Beijing.

Investigations have found that the Confucius Institute deliberately concealed the history of the Tiananmen Square incident, deliberately distort the fact that Taiwan's sovereignty is independent of China, maliciously vilified the personality of the Dalai Lama, and endangered the freedom of thought and speech in academic education.

Indonesian Delegation Visits Taiwan's Jakarta Office to Discuss Migrant Worker Freeze

Wednesday, February 24, 2021

Indonesian officials in charge of migrant worker issues visited Taiwan's representative office in the capital city of Jakarta Monday (Feb. 22) to exchange views about the East Asian nation's freeze on migrant workers.

Three previous rounds of bilateral discussion failed to overcome the impasse. However, Indonesia has postponed changes to its worker placement fee policy, which Taiwanese employers are opposed to, until July.

Benny Rhamdani, the head of the Agency for the Placement and Protection of Indonesian Migrant Workers (BP2MI), visited the Taiwanese office and invited its officials to learn more about coronavirus testing and prevention measures at the main migrant worker training center, CNA reported.

The freeze on Indonesian workers, imposed last December, was partly the consequence of too many of the workers testing positive for coronavirus in Taiwan despite having received a negative PRC test result in their home country.

Malaysian Wins Challenge Against Islamic Law Banning Gay Sex

Facebook and Google have become accustomed to an open world of information on which to build their closed ecosystems. Not any more. Australia is proceeding with a new media code that will force platforms to pay for news and bargain with news publishers.

While Google has complied, Facebook called the regulators' bluff by banning Australian news from its platform, before reaching a deal with the Australian government that allows it to avoid the new code, but only if it signs agreements with key publishers.

Thailand's prime minister said on Thursday (Feb 25) his meeting with Myanmar's military-appointed foreign minister this week following a coup in the neighbouring country did not mean "endorsement".

The meeting on Wednesday mainly saw him listening to Wunna Maung Lwin, appointed by the Myanmar military who seized power earlier this month, about "political developments" and the situation in Myanmar, Thai Prime Minister Prayut Chan-ocha told reporters.

He also denied that Thailand has joined Indonesia in becoming a mediator to solve the situation in Myanmar.
