Taiwan-Asia Exchange Foundation: A New Practice for Think-and-Do Tank

The Taiwan-Asia Exchange Foundation (TAEF) was conceptualized after the first Yushan Forum in 2017, as part of President Tsai's New Southbound Policy (NSP). It was inaugurated in April 2018 as a think tank to promote comprehensive ties between Taiwan and the 10 ASEAN countries, 6 South Asian states as well as Australia and New

Zealand.

This article provides an overview of TAEF's objectives, projects and future direction. As a pilot think-and-do tank, the TAEF aims to build up and strengthen international exchange through five flagship programs: youth leadership, civil society connectivity, think tank collaboration, regional resilience and cultural exchange. TAEF actively builds partnerships and networks with like-minded partners to achieve the people-centered connection that the NSP aspires towards. These efforts culminate in the yearly Yushan Forum which celebrates and facilitates Taiwan's relationships with the NSP countries by providing a platform for cross-country dialogue. TAEF will continue to strengthen its efforts in promoting and evaluating the NSP, deepen collaboration with regional partners, and broaden the perspective of Taiwanese society regarding Taiwan and its relationship with its neighbors in the region.

Trade and Investment Between India and Taiwan Set For Major Growth

 ${f R}$ ecent statements from the Department of Investment Services of the Ministry of

Economic Affairs (MOEA) indicate that the economic and trade partnership between India and Taiwan is on track for steady growth over the coming years.

In 2018, total Taiwanese investment in India increased by a multiple of 12, with 21 applications for major investments totaling over US\$360 million were approved by MOEA. In 2017, there were only 8 investment applications totaling US\$30.5 million.

The workshop underscores the government's commitment to assisting Vietnam enhance disease management capabilities. It also builds upon progress achieved at the same event last year and two visits to the Southeast Asian nation for Taiwan TB control professionals in March and September 2018.

After its run in India, the expo is scheduled to visit Penang, Malaysia from July 5-6; Hanoi, Vietnam, Aug. 8-10; Surabaya, Indonesia, Sept. 26-28; and Davao City, the Philippines, Nov. 8-9.
