Taiwan Records 10 Millionth Foreign Visitor for 2018

Foreign visitor arrivals to Taiwan this year reached 10 million on the weekend, hitting that mark for the fourth consecutive year.

So far this year, Huang Yi-ping, section chief at the bureau's International Travel Division, Tourism Bureau, said 25 percent of the foreign visitor arrivals have been from the 18 countries in Southeast Asia, South Asia and Oceania listed in the New Southbound Policy. The annual increase this year in arrivals from Southeast Asian

countries has been 20 percent, from the Philippines 50 percent, and from Vietnam 30 percent, she said.

Focus Taiwan MOFA to Launch more New Southbound Policy Training Courses

Only 40% of RCEP Items Finalized: Officials

With just about 40% of the agenda items having been resolved, there is still a long way to go before the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership intelligence agency had barred it from using equipment provided by China's Huawei in its 5G network as it posed "significant national security risks".

The move follows reports the United States is urging its allies to exclude the Chinese telecoms giant from 5G roll-outs over cyber security fears. Spark said in a statement that it was legally obliged to inform the Government Communications Security Bureau (GCSB) about its 5G plans.
