Hundreds of Indonesian Workers Attend Online Business Workshop

Over 200 Indonesian migrant workers gathered in Taipei on Sunday to learn more about how to open online businesses and have a way to support themselves when they return home, according to the organizers.

The workers, mostly caregivers and factory workers, attended a workshop at the GIS Taipei Tech Convention Center at which Arif Sulistiyo, director of trade at the Indonesian Economic and Trade Office to Taipei, gave a presentation on starting an online shop.

The 38-year-old Arif guided the workers through the preparations involved, such as getting a business license and figuring out how income tax should be calculated. "E-commerce training for migrant workers is very important because it fosters an entrepreneurial mentality. Hopefully, they will not have to be migrant workers forever," Arif said.

Malaysian Transport Minister Wee Ka Siong has assured Johor Ruler Sultan Ibrahim Iskandar that the Rapid Transit System Link (RTS) between Johor Baru and Singapore will be completed within the stipulated time frame.

A day after the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) agreement was concluded in India's absence, Indian Minister of External Affairs Subrahmanyam Jaishankar launched a scathing attack on trade and globalisation.

"In the name of openness, we have allowed subsidised products and unfair production advantages from abroad to prevail," he said, asserting that the Indian government had decided to move away from trading arrangements in pursuit

With 57.3 and 9.3 million members, Nahdlatul Ulama (NU) and Muhammadiyah respectively have played critical roles in legitimising the compatibility of Islam and democracy and discrediting extreme religious teachings in Indonesia.
